On 2nd October, the students were visited by our school nurse, who came in to talk to the girls about healthy eating and living a healthy lifestyle.






IT WAS A WALK IN THE PARK!!

Ofsted October 2018



<u>PUNCTUALITY</u>

Good punctuality at school is essential for students to achieve their full educational potential. It is also vital for students to form good habits for later life.

All students are expected to arrive punctually for school in the morning and to arrive punctually for each lesson. A register is taken at the start of the day and in the afternoon. Students arriving late are recorded as thus on the register.

According to DfE guidelines, registers must be closed after a certain time in the morning. Therefore, if a student arrives after 9.15am, they cannot receive a late mark but have to be marked as absent for the whole morning session. If the lateness is due to a legitimate reason e.g. a medical appointment, the absence can be authorised. Otherwise, the session is marked as an unauthorised absence.

Please could all parents try to make medical appointments outside of school hours.
